

Partner families 64 and 65 are all the way through the process and we will begin construction on their homes just as soon as we can. We are still working with families and hope to have at least one more approved soon. we will have a member of the Home Owner Selection team reach out to the prospective family.

You probably saw in the newspaper that we have expanded our home renovation program. It used to be focused on exterior painting and lawn clean up, it is now building accessibility ramps, and doing other interior renovations designed to help people stay in their homes a little while longer. Recently, we hired Trever Shelden as our project manager to help make this transition successful. We have three of those projects lined up and looking for more. People needing assistance should call the office (605.697.2540) and we will mail them an application.

We recently purchased two building lots in Madison, SD and have begun the process of finding partner families in Lake County. Our website lists income guidelines for both counties we serve.

As we plan for the future it is also the time we wrap things up. Our fiscal year ends on June 30 so we are working hard to raise the money needed to finish this year's projects and have the resources to accomplish all we hope to in the future.

Habitat for Humanity gets no direct government funding. We have been able to access money from the state through its Housing Opportunity Fund. For the last several years this fund has been the state's principal mechanism for supporting affordable housing projects across the state. That fund has very few dollars left and we have been told not to expect it to be refilled anytime soon.

As a result, your support is even more important than it has been in the past. Please fill out the enclosed card and send it, along with your gift, to our offices. You can trust we will be good stewards of your hard-earned dollars. Your gifts have an enormous impact on the lives of your neighbors.
