Wulf is responsible for leading BAHfH's dedicated team of staff and volunteers in building affordable housing in Brookings and Lake counties, as well as for the Oahe Habitat affiliate in Pierre. Her specific duties will include administration and staff development, fundraising, volunteer leadership, and family, community and stakeholder relations.

BAHfH Board President Keith Rounds said Wulf demonstrates the passion and professionalism that will lead the successful Brookings affiliate to even greater accomplishments.

"As we celebrate our 30th year of building decent and affordable housing for the communities we serve, Jess brings not just a background well-suited to this position, but an enthusiasm and creativity that is invaluable," said Rounds. "The Board is excited to have her begin her new responsibilities, and we look forward to her leadership and implementation of the strategy that reflects our vision and mission."

Wulf also was the Housing Committee Chair for the Brookings Empowerment Project.
